In 1736 he had fully improved 150 acres, from whence he had 95 bushels of Indian corn, 40 of potatoes, & 22 of rice, he let his greatest house, and lives much at a plantation some miles in the County. He read 31st Court roll on 24th June removal 24 Oct. 1738. Turn'd a violent molester 1640. he mory'd about March 1739/40 but I know not who

7 He had a grant made him of 500 acres 4 July 1733

He took land some miles up in the country, but has yet no grant of it. He lives in mate on the Wrd. Cooper's lot N^o. 20. But she complains he pays her no rent. 24th Month 1740 he was restored to his Office of 1. Bailif, having left drinking.

One 21 Oct. 1738 Mr. Dykeshoop rescued him from being surveyor and first Constable, but afterwards gave him the command of the Negroes.
